

Rules and Regulations for B.T. Brown Reservoir B.T. Brown permits run calendar year-January to December Cost for the permit: January-June \$40.00 & July-December \$25.00

- B.T. Brown Reservoir will be open for use <u>by permit holders only</u>. Permits are available for Coweta County Residents, with proof of residency, and can be obtained at the Water Authority office at 545 Corinth Road, Newnan, Georgia, Monday–Friday from 7:30am 5:30pm.
- B.T. Brown Reservoir is open to permit holders during <u>Summer hours (Daylight Savings Time Beginning the second Sunday in March and ending the second Sunday in November) and Winter hours (Standard Time Beginning the second Monday in November and ending the second Monday in March):</u>
 - o **Summer Hours:** Monday Sunday 8:00am 8:00pm
 - o Winter Hours: Monday Sunday 8:00am 6:00pm
- Parking is allowed only in designated parking spaces. Parking on grassy areas or outside of the gate is prohibited. Automobiles will be towed at owner's expense.
- All Georgia Fishing and Boating Laws apply. All Largemouth Bass 14" & under shall be released. All carp fish must be released immediately.
- Minors must be accompanied by an adult. No one under 16 years of age may operate a watercraft which is either electronic or manually operated.

• Prohibited Activities:

- **ELECTRIC MOTORS ONLY –** Gasoline motors or fuel tanks, rubber or vinyl rafts, and stand-up paddle boards are prohibited. All batteries must be bolted or strapped to vessel.
- No fishing from the bank/shoreline.
- No more than 15 boats on the reservoir at one time including kayaks and canoes.
- Fishing tournaments are strictly prohibited.
- No swimming or wading.
- No alcoholic beverages.
- No loitering or littering..
- No pets or horses.

Alligator has been sighted in the reservoir. Please use caution.

Restricted Areas:

No one, except authorized personnel, will be allowed in the following areas:

- The dam area including the spillway.
- The valve structure and associated catwalk.
- The outfall structure and the area below the dam structure.

Any permit holder found in violation of any rule will have their permit permanently revoked and be subject to prosecution under Georgia Law.
